

From the Club minutes for Friday 14th June 1901, as follows:

**The following telegram was read from Mr. Andrew Dunlop sent from Islay-**

"Have arranged Exhibition Match two rounds Pollok Monday afternoon and evening, Herd. Consideration twenty five pounds call Committee meeting, that Pollok members guarantee, show this Easton Hunter and Macara we suggest you advise newspapers. The members present considered that this arrangement was a most desirable one, an opinion that such an Exhibition would greatly further the interests of the Club and it was by Mr Wilson and seconded by Mr Neil that these four professionals be brought to Pollok to relieve the individual members of all liability for the expenses which they have guaranteed. The expenses in connection therewith form a charge against the revenue of the Club for the year. It was agreed that in consideration of our position in Pollok and from the fact of it being a private club gates could not be thrown open to the public. It was therefore decided to confine the exhibition to members and their friends. The Secretary was instructed to issue postcards to the members in which the match had been arranged and requesting each member to produce his Fixture Card on entrance.

The members present were approved by sub-committee to complete the arrangements.
